## Wine Country Classic in April

### New Select Triplets Tournament Picked For Season Opener

The VOMPC premieres its 1995 tournament series next month with the new 'Wine Country Classic,' a Select Triplets competition set for Sunday, April 23, in Sonoma.

Registration will be open 10-11 a.m., with tournament play starting at 11:30 a.m. Cash prizes go to the winners. And the entry fee of \$15 per team includes complimentary pastis.

In what may be a preview of the national playoffs in May, several of California's strongest triplet teams are expected to compete in this inaugural 'Wine Country Classic.' As one savvy, out-of-town player put it, "It's the same town. Same playing field. We're looking ahead to this one as a good warm-up for the championship playoffs." Byron Mayo and Mike Norton will coordinate the event.

#### **Final Research Results**

During January, we conducted a survey to see if there are more activities or new directions that would be of interest to our members. Twenty-three people responded to the questionnaire. That was half of the 1995 membership at that time. So it represented a good sampling of the club's most interested and most active members.

The findings indicate that, overall, we are pursuing the right direction in 1995. There was no mandate for change. A few new ideas did gain some genuine interest, however. And we are now considering these in our future plans.

There's an interest in regularly scheduled play, for example; and in scheduled mixed doubles. The idea of more social events and potluck picnics also drew good response. But the real surprise was the strong appeal of incorporating 'doubles' into Summer League competition. Summer League 'doubles' and 'singles' were at the top of the findings.

Finally, the board recognized that in our very active club, every weekday-afternoon from 4 p.m. on -- from now well into November -- you'll find club members out playing on the Valley of the Moon pétanque courts. That's also true on Sunday afternoons from about 2 p.m. until dusk. So those broad and popular time periods are now designated 'regularly scheduled playing times' for our Valley of the Moon Pétanque Club. Come on out and enjoy.

**News Note** -- 1995 FPUSA licenses are required for play in federation-sponsored tournaments, including the U.S. national playoffs May 27-28 in Sonoma.

# Time is Running Out For Unpaid Members

#### Countdown Begins For National Championship Tournament In Sonoma

In less than three months, the Valley of the Moon Pétanque Club will proudly host the FPUSA's National Pétanque Championship Tournament. A special VOMPC task force began planning for the event in early January. Thanks to the efforts of committee members Louis Toulon, Barbara and Ken Steiper, Annick and John Bouldt, Jacques Mathieu, Frank Pipal, Jean Markson and Susan and Mike Norton, the vision of this first-ever national tournament in Sonoma is gradually coming into focus.

A preliminary notice has been forwarded to clubs throughout the United States. Registration packets will be available for all interested FPUSA members starting March 13. We expect as many as 40 to 50 teams to register, including several VOMPC entries.

Cost is \$60 per select triplet team. That includes Saturday lunch. Registration deadline is Friday, May 19. Tournament draw will be on Sunday, May 21.

#### Preliminary Schedule of events:

<u>Friday, May 26.</u> Welcoming party. 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. Wine and cheese at the courts.

Saturday, May 27. Opening rounds of the championship. 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Sunday May 28. The final day --

Morning. Consolante tournament for those not qualifying for the final rounds of the championship.

<u>Afternoon</u>. Final rounds of this national championship playoff tournament..

Evening. Special awards banquet and presentations. \$30 per person.

#### Time to Assemble Teams

If you haven't already started, now is the time to put together your team. We hope to demonstrate to the foremost players from around the country that the game of pétanque is alive and well in the Valley of the Moon.

If you're not entering the event, mark your calendar anyway and plan to attend. This is your opportunity to witness the best pétanque this country has to offer.

The winning team will proudly represent the USA at the 1995 *Championnat du Monde* in Brussels, Belgium, next fall.

## The Umpire's Box...

Q. "Opening the round, I threw the cochonnet out a legal nine meters. But then, the first boule I tossed hit the cochonnet – pushing it on out to 12 meters. Should play continue at that point? Or, do I bring the cochonnet back and throw it again?"

A. The throw was valid, even though the cochonnet was hit beyond 10 meters by the first boule tossed. Play continues at the point where the cochonnet landed after being hit by the boule -- unless the cochonnet was knocked outside the defined boundary, or unless it landed in a pool of water where it's floating freely, or unless it cannot be seen from the starting circle.
