Winning Trio Goes To World Championships

Anticipation continues to build as we make final preparations to host the 1995 West Coast National Championship of Pétanque. During Memorial Day weekend, the very best players in the nation compete for \$1,500 in prize money and the honor of representing the United States in the International Federation's

Triplets Championship to be held next September in Brussels, Belgium.

The winning team takes home \$750 and a championship award. The second-place winner collects \$375. And a

prize of \$200 goes to the third-place trio.

For those teams eliminated early from the championship, there is a double elimination consolante event. \$150 for first place, \$85 for second. We're also planning special prizes for certain categories of teams not sharing in the top prize money. These inclue best Northern California team, best Sonoma Valley team and best women's team.

Absolute registration deadline is Friday, May 19. No late registrations accepted. That means a registration form must be <u>received</u> by that date. Registration fee is \$60 per team. At least two members of each team must be U.S. citizens; and all players must be 1995 FPUSA members. (We recommend you bring your license.) Teams may be male, female or mixed.

On Sunday morning, players not entering the championship may register and play in the consolante tournament. The fee is \$7 per person. Those teams eliminated from the championship are automatically entered in the consolante for no additional fee.

Festivities commence with an informal wine and cheese reception at the VOMPC courts starting at 5:30 p.m. on Friday, May 26. Team draws are held at this time.

Tournament play begins on Saturday, shortly after the welcoming and introductions at 9:30 a.m. Box lunches are provided to all participants on Saturday. The box lunches are also available for purchase by spectators. Closing matches on

the first day start about 4 p.m.

On Sunday, consolante registration opens at 7:30 a.m., with play starting after the draw at 8:30 a.m. Continuation of championship play begins at 11:30 a.m. Lunch is available for purchase by both players and spectators. Consolante play should end about 4 p.m. The championship semi-finals are scheduled for 3:30 p.m. and finals for 5 p.m.

A festive awards banquet and raffle drawing follows at Andrews Hall, with a reception beginning at 7 p.m. We look forward to a great turnout and a lot of fun.

Two Summer Leagues!


In response to the strong member interest, two different Summer Leagues are in the works for the VOMPC this year.
