THE UMPIRE'S CORNER

Once and for all, will you please settle a question that keeps coming up at the courts? When you play more than one game in a series, who gets to go first at the start of the next game? Is it the winner or the loser of the previous game?

Throughout the world of pétanque it has long been a gracious tradition to allow the *loser* to go first when you're playing a social game among friends.

However, in a serious match, where control of the cochonnet can be a tactical advantage, some tournament directors will specify that the winner starts the next game.

No FPUSA rules cover your question. So it's a local option. Any club can specify the rules for playing on that club's home courts. Or, in lieu of any local rules or local tradition, you simply make certain both sides agree right at the start on which approach to follow.
