VOMPC Bid Wins 1997 National Tournament

Singles Championship Scheduled May 24-25

starting the New Year off with a bang, the FPUSA this week announced that our Valley of the Moon Pétanque Club has won the bid to host the FPUSA's 1997 singles championship.

Scheduled for Saturday and Sunday, May 24-25, the prestigious two-day event will be coordinated by a special VOMPC task force that includes Tom Bricca, Peter Mathis and Jon Des Pois.

On May 25, second day of the tournament, the VOMPC will also host an open random triplets tournament.

"This side tournament will give single players who are eliminated on Saturday a chance to compete again on Sunday," according to Tom. "This should be an added draw for people who will have traveled long distances to play pétanque."

THE UMPIRE'S CORNER

What do you do at the end of a round of play, if the closest boule for each team ends up exactly the same distance from the cochonnet? Exactly the same! That happened in a game at the courts last week.

Very simple. If that happens and it's the end of the round and nobody has any boules left to play, you declare the entire round void. Then, you start the round over. The cochonnet is again tossed by the team that won the previous round.

Board Revises Cost for Family Memberships

he VOMPC must now pay the national Federation of Pétanque/USA eight dollars annually for every member. This covers national FPUSA membership and liability insurance.

In order to avoid a potential loss to the club on our *family* memberships, the VOMPC board recently revised the group dues structure.

Family memberships in 1997 will be \$30 for a family of two and \$8 for each additional family member up to 16 years of age.

This new approach will provide insurance protection for each family member, still provide a family with an advantageous group rate, and at the same time protect the club from a loss.

At the club's next annual meeting, the directors plan to submit this interim 1997 approach to a vote of the total membership, for revision of the by-laws.

1997 World Games Set for Lahti, Finland in August

ruce Frigard is looking for a few, adventurous souls to join him on a sojourn to Lahti, Finland this summer for the 1997 World Games.

Scheduled for August 7-17, the games will take place in the sports-crazy city of Lahti, located just 400 miles south of the arctic circle, where locals will invite you to play pétanque around the clock under a pale midnight sun.

The World Games is a giant, multi-sports event organized every fourth year for some 36 different sports not yet in the Olympic Games program.

Pétanque competitions and boule lyonnaise exhibitions will take place August 9-10.

At these 1997 summer games in Finland, some 2,500 athletes are expected to compete in both individual and team events.

The City of Lahti also has been selected as the site for the Nordic World Ski Championships in the year 2001.

Thank you all for the support and kindness we Pipals received from you following George's death. I really didn't surprise us as we know that that's the kind of people you are.


