Four VOMPC Players Make it into the "Final 16"

aster chef Alain Gilot of Sun Valley, Idaho, cooked up his own recipe for success at the 1997 *Tête-à-Tête* Championship in Sonoma, May 25. He outpointed the veteran Gerard Canabou of Menlo Park in the final match, 13-5, winning the FPUSA's Number One ranking in the U.S. for 1997.

George Rouveyrol from Los Angeles defeated Patrick Vaslet of San Francisco for third place honors.

In another great California match-up, San Francisco's Mike Rago took fifth place, edging out L.A.'s M. Nguyen.

Rounding out the final, eight contenders, L.A.'s Max LeGrand came in seventh, beating Yngve Bilsted, the genial Dane from New York, who settled for eighth place.

Our Valley of the Moon Pétanque Club placed four players in the final 16: Jon Des Pois, Mike Norton, Frank Pipal and Tom Tetard. A proud showing.

On Sunday, a select doubles tournament attracted players who didn't make it into the *Tête-à-Tête's* final 16. This secondary event was won by our own Peter Mathis and John Bouldt, who handily defeated Tom and Ly Nguyen from Los Angeles, 13-6.




CHAMPIONSHIP FORM AT THE NATIONAL TÊTE-À-TÊTE TOURNAMENT




Number 1: Alain Gilot won \$800
