

ur '97 Grand Concours de Pétanque, sponsored by Ravenswood, drew the biggest Bastille Day luncheon crowd we've had in the past three years.


It was a beautiful summer day, July 13, as eighty-four, hungry people worked their way through the picnic line.


Jean Markson and Mike Norton also have agreed to accept nominations for the 1998-99 board.

# **VOMPC Code of Conduct Adopted by Directors**

#### Proposed Code to be Voted Upon by Members

In response to continuing requests from members, the VOMPC board of directors, by unanimous vote, has adopted a Code of Conduct as a standard for civility on the courts and at other club functions.

The complete code, including penalties, and procedures for handling complaints about offensive behavior, will be submitted to members for approval.

In the annual election, if a majority of the voting members approve the Code, it will become an adjunct to the club's By-Laws.



### Code of Conduct

The purpose of this code is to help promote and ensure a civil and genial atmosphere on the Valley of the Moon pétanque courts.

- 1. The VOMPC membership agrees that civility, courtesy, mutual respect and integrity shall characterize the behavior of VOMPC members while at the VOM pétanque courts, VOMPC functions, or any other FPUSA club functions.
- 2. The VOMPC membership agrees that it will not tolerate foul or abusive behavior, discourtesy, excessive arguing, belligerence, or any other offensive behavior which detracts from the civil and genial atmosphere of our club.

In Singles, the top four players in each division move into the playoffs on Saturday, September 20.


In Doubles, the top six teams go to the playoffs on Saturday, September 27.
