With its *Sunday* "picnic and pétanque" series, the new program will offer club members and newcomers a relaxed and welcoming atmosphere in which to enjoy the game.

At the same time, the exciting and unusual 1998 schedule of tournaments on *Saturday* will keep the competitive juices flowing.



Umpire's Corner Juggles Paradox in FPUSA Rules

iven the ambiguities of authority, is it any surprise that the official rules of Pétanque contradict themselves?

How about this one? In our last issue, somebody tossed a rare predicament at the Umpire's Corner:

"Today, I shot my opponent's first boule far out of bounds. But my boule went out of bounds, too. No boules remained on the court.

My question: When that happens, who plays the next boule?"

Our esteemed umpire, Pierre Joske, answered the question with a quick, forthright response: "When your boule went out of bounds, it became invalid. Out of play. So with no boules on the court, your opponent who tossed the first boule, plays again."

Pierre knew what he was talking about. He knew that Article 16 in the rules book says, "If the first boule played goes out of play, the opponent plays, and so on, alternately, while there are no boules in play."

Now that's clear, right? Wrong! The rules book goes on to contradict itself in the next paragraph when it says, "If after firing or pointing, no boules are left in play, the last team to play plays again."

For several hours, maybe days, Pierre Joske and his learned colleagues, Louis Toulon and John Krauer, pondered over the apparent paradox. In the end, they decided this obscure ambiguity in the official rules should be addressed at the next board meeting of the Federation of Pétanque U.S.A.

Meanwhile, if such a predicament happens to you, let the *on-site* umpire make the decision. No umpire? Just flip a coin!

As they say in Marseilles, "I'esprit de contradiction."
