



Michael Rago and Albert Lucas took third place.

Chuck Fleming and Jacques Mathieu of the VOMPC won the *Consolante*, with second place going to Bill Carter and Bob Bosko.

This tournament was scheduled to be the club's initial experiment with "A" and "B" levels of play. But all 32 players arrived in the mood for heavy competition.

All sixteen teams opted to go all-out in the Class "A" category.

Coordinated by Tom Bricca, it was, indeed, a Class "A" Valley of the Moon Pétanque Club competition, no question about it.

THE UMPIRE'S CORNER...

This may be a stupid question, • but I'm new to the game, so bear with How do you know when a boule is out of bounds? Some courts have string border inside the logs, some don't. And even the oldtimers seem to argue about whether a boule is out of bounds or not.

For tournaments in Sonoma, we use string to mark end court boundaries.

Once a boule rolls <u>all the way</u> across the string, it's out of bounds.

In between tournaments, the string sometimes gets broken and it's not replaced until the next tournament.

If no string boundary exists, we use the logs as the boundary. When a boule hits the log, it's out of bounds and should be removed from play.
