

My boule was the close to cochonnet. Mv opponent's best boule was two feet away. tossed my last boule. It looked to me as if it was good for a second point. But before I could walk down and check it, my opponent picked up his boule and said I got one point. Is that legal?

No, it is not legal.
No player should pick up his boules until both sides agree on the points.

Furthermore, unless your opponent had marked the position of his boule, which isn't likely, the boule he picked up prematurely was void. You had every right to claim two points.
