The firm deadline for registration Sunday morning is 10 a.m. Entry fee is \$6.




Member Guest Invitational

City Plans Total Depot Park Restrooms Rehabilitation

Good news! The City of Sonoma, with an \$80,000 federal grant in hand, plans the complete rehabilitation of the aging restrooms at Depot Park, north of the VOMPC pétanque courts.

The scope of the design project includes access for the disabled, in addition to a park maintenance office and workshop building. The only downside to the project as it now stands is the timing. We are now heading into the heart of the pétanque season. And the city staff says the work will not be completed until the end of the year. Still, the project is welcome news for pétanquers. And the job site problem is temporary.

Fifteen VOMPers had a great day of pétanque at the winery, accompanied by an abundance of hot food and fresh baked bread as well as vinicological offerings





A water line for a new drinking fountain and a future irrigation system was dug and laid. For the recently-approved dumpster enclosure, fence posts were set into the ground next to the new shed site.

Yards and yards of leaves, Eucylyptus bark and debris were cleared from the courts and surrounding areas by the small army of rake-wielding club members. Yards and yards of sand were wheel-barrowed to the water line trench and shovelled in for backfill. Yards and yards of gravel and quarry fines were spread on the East courts and groomed into the surface in preparation for the upcoming season.

The mail box was empty this month. No questions came in for our certified FPUSA answer man, Umpire Pierre Joske.


However, with the start of the new season, we expect that situation will soon change.


