
Cash prizes totaling more than \$1,100 will be spread among the winners, along with special championship awards from the FPUSA and the VOMPC.

Tête à Tête Win Goes to "Raymond"

Peter Mathis Second In '99 Season Opener

ith a wink and a nod to his fans on the sidelines, Raymond Nielsen walked away winner at our opening day Tête à Tête tournament, March 21.

Nielson defeated VOMPC ace Peter Mathis in the head-to-head finals, 13-4.

The match that drew the biggest crowd of the day, however, was a tense, semi-final thriller between Peter Mathis and Louis Toulon.


Each point was a close one, as Peter slowly built up a sizeable early lead. But Louis came roaring back late in the game and took over the lead, making it 12-11.

Then came the play of the day: With an artful, left-curl roll, Peter snaked his last boule inside the pack, close to the cochonnet, for two points and the victory, 13-12.

VOMPC's battling Bill Miller had a great day, too, making it all the way to the semi-finals, before losing to Raymond Nielsen, 5-13.

The *Consolante* went to Patrick Vaslet in a hard-fought 13-10 win over Antonio Lafaro.

Lookin' Good, at Menlo Park

A contingent of VOMPC players with nerves of steel surprised the experts at La Boule Rouillee's International Pétanque Masters Doublette in Menlo Park, March 27-28.

In what some pétanquers called a tune-up for the May championships in Sonoma, VOMPC's Jon Des Pois and Tom Bricca grabbed second place. And Frank Pipal and Ken Stieper came in third.

A portent of good things to come?

The peninsula duo of Gerard Martin and Robert Pierre won the event, which attracted a total of 31 men's team entries and 10 women's team entries.

Schedule Changes, October-November

The date for the VOMPC Club Championship, select triples, has been changed from Sunday, September 26, to Sunday, September 19, because of a conflict with the FPUSA's original timing for the world qualifier tournament in Los Angeles.

The date for our final tournament of the year, select doubles, has been changed from Sunday, October 17, to Sunday, October 24, in order to avoid conflict with the annual Sonoma Vintage Festival.

Both of these changes will be reflected in a new 1999 schedule, which you will receive as an insert in the next issue of the newsletter.

At the end of a round, my last boule knocked the cochonnet far across court. My"know-it-all" opponent measured the full distance. About 25 meters. He then said my cochonnet was out of bounds and that we had to start the round over. How come? The rule book says the jack is dead only if it's displaced to more than 30 meters! So a 25 meter distance is O.K. Right?

Wrong!
You are looking at an old rulebook.
Early last year, the FPUSA changed the limit to 20 meters and published a revised rulebook. You should have received a copy. If you didn't, call the VOMPC club secretary and she can help you to get one.

Maysonnave Memorial Bench Dedication Set for May 26 at VOMPC Pétanque Courts

Valley of the Moon Pétanque Club Honors Generous Local Frenchman

n a lasting tribute to Henri Maysonnave, the ebullient Frenchman who owned the land where our pétanque courts are located, the VOMPC is dedicating a seven-foot rammed-earth bench with cast concrete top and stone memorial plaque, to be installed at the south entrance of the courts.

Members and the public are invited to the dedication ceremonies, set for 5 p.m., Wednesday, May 26, followed by a rousing evening of pétanque.

Spearheaded by VOMPC members Jacques Mathieu and Frank Pipal, the Maysonnave bench is VOMPC memorial project approved by the citv in September 1996.

Mathieu, president of MaTerre International, is donating the bench. Frank Pipal is donating the cast concrete top. Club funds are paying for the stone plaque. And other club members are contributing sweat and labor.

Henri Maysonnave, well-known philanthropist and City of Sonoma *Alcade*, died in 1988. He willed to the city the pétanque court property and adjacent cottages.

Maysonnave was a man who enjoyed good pétanque and good wine and good conversation.
