THE UMPIRE'S CORNER ...


Last month in San Rafael, a woman on ■ the opposing team tossed one of my boules instead of her own. Is there a penalty for this kind of mistake?

Not usually. Mix-ups like this do happen. In a social game, you replace wrong boule with the correct boule and get on with your game. It's no big problem.

In a key tournament, however, it would be more serious. After the boule is offending the replaced. player would get an official warning. And if it happened again, the offending player's boule would be disqualified and anything it moved would be put back in place.




Picnic, Pétanque On Father's Day

Summer League Doubles 2000

Welcome to Summer League Doubles for the year 2000

As this year's director of the league I would be delighted to see a broader cross-section of V.O.M.P.C. membership get involved in the league. This is not a "men's league", it is open to everyone. With this in mind I encourage hardened veterans of leagues past to seek new partnerships and shake up the status quo.

To make it easier for all club members to participate, matches will be one game only - to be played one a week. Once team sign-ups are complete, random assignments will be made to a round-robin style playsheet. According to the number of teams signed up, there will be either one or two divisions. The best part is that instead of wondering which team on your list to call, your week by week adversaries will be pre-arranged, and you will only have to set up a rendezvous that both teams can keep. It's that easy!

Entry Fee: \$10 per player = \$20 per team. Both players must be V.O.M.P.C. members.

Sign-ups: Sign-up Deadline is May 19th. Play will begin the week of June 4th.

Matches: Each match will be played to 13 points under F.P.U.S.A. (International) rules.

Timing: Your match may take place any mutually agreeable time from Sunday through the following Saturday of the assigned week.

Withdrawals: A team which withdraws from the league for any reason will not receive a refund. Their matches will be voided and the standings adjusted.

Make-up weeks: The schedule includes a make-up week every fourth week. This will allow for re-scheduling of matches missed for illness or other unforeseen circumstances. Known absences (e.g. vacations) may be accommodated this way - or by playing ahead of the schedule if the opposing team is willing.

Checkpoints: At the end of the make-up week, the three matches for that period must be completed and the scores reported. Unplayed matches will be recorded as losses for both teams.

Final Standings: Final Standings will be based on Matches Won/Lost percentages. In the event of a tie, first recourse will be to the result of the match between the two during regular divisional play, with points for/against as a last resort.

League Rules, reporting forms, playoff and consolante details will be included in the playlist mailing you will receive when you're signed up for the league.


