# THE UMPIRE'S CORNER ...

My little book on International Rules of Pétanque says the game is played up to 13 points with the possibility of league and elimination games up to 11 points.

In this year's Summer League Doubles we have to play a 15-point game.

Isn't this illegal?

In the tradition of the game and according to the rules of the International Federation de Pétanque et jeu Provençal, the game of pétanque is played to 13 points.

Definitely.

However, if a league or a tournament is not a certified FPUSA or FIPJP event, then a local club can set the point limit at any level it wants, or its players will accept.

nder blazing skies, sixtytwo loyal subjects of Emperor Norton II came together at the Sonoma courts May 21 for a zany day of feasting and pétanque.


