


If approved by the board, the policy would establish guidelines for the club in the solicitation or acceptance of sponsors.

The committee may also consider setting graduating levels of sponsorship in line with the amount or value of a sponsor's contribution.

In return, the club's level of support and recognition for sponsors would also be considered by the committee.

In a follow-up to the board's unanimous vote, VOMPC President Ed Porto named Jacques Mathieu to head up the Sponsorship Committee.

Members OK Dues Increase For Next Year

VOMPC annual dues will increase next year to \$30 for individuals, \$45 for a family membership, and \$12 for juniors under 18.

The increase comes as the result of a favorable vote on a by-laws change during the club's annual election. Final tally was sixty-six "for" and two "against."

This marks the first increase in the basic dues structure since 1993.

The increased dues, according to outgoing President Ed Porto, will help the club pursue court improvements and help cover increased FPUSA payments triggered by rising insurance costs.

Details on the new dues structure will be mailed to all members soon.

Holly Sammons Second, Erika Schmitt Third


aren Semerau at 7-0 stood undefeated at the end of regular play in the autumn Women's Singles League.

WINTER DOUBLES LEAGUE?

How does this sound?

A mid-winter doubles league that links a veteran member with a newcomer on each team—and offers cash prizes with no entry fee?

That was the intriguing New Year's idea proposed by President Ed Porto at the October 10 board meeting, as a way of getting new members more involved, build enthusiasm for the game, and at the same time help newcomers to sharpen their pétanque skills.

Ed told the board that a vet/newcomer winter league would provide a bit of structure to the mentoring which veteran club members do so well on a casual basis at the courts already.

"For long-time members, helping newcomers is fun and rewarding," he said. "It also helps to build camaraderie among the membership."

Ed's proposal called for the club to fund the prize structure and eliminate an entry fee, as a way of further encouraging both veterans and newcomers to participate.

After board discussion of the proposal, it was decided to hold off making such an expenditure commitment and to let the entire proposal be reviewed by the new 2001 board of directors.



"Great Balls of Fire" Win a Wild Shoot Out


