On Sunday April 22, the Second Annual VOMPC Mixed Doublette (select) takes place. Arranging your own team is advised, but you can come early for on-site match-making.


Showcase your culinary creations as potluck lunch will be the order of the day.


We're Looking for a Few Good Volunteers!



Carter, Porto and Wellington took third place over Pascal Gravier, John Krauer and P.J. Mallette, 13-11.





It's time to get our courts in shape for the new season



So, git yer rake, shovel or just your work gloves and come to the courts. It'll be a BLAST!



of divots and données...

As winter winds down and spring heats up, you might notice the surface of the courts hardening. You may have also noticed the multitude of small craters left in the ground from boules landing in the soft wet clay over the winter months.

As a favor to our courts—and as a way to focus and fine-tune your game, pay attention to your landing spot (called a *donnée*, pronounced "doh-NAY"). It is legal (and optional), only for the team who's turn it is next, to "fix" the *donnée* of the *previous* (and only the previous) boule played, regardless of which team threw it.

Assuming that your boule makes a divot, it behooves the fastidious player to go to the spot and smooth it out a bit with your foot. It not only will aid your next boule if it lands there, doing this will slow down your game a bit and help you focus and "read" the terrain better. (Watch the veteran players do this sometime, and you will see it is quite a common practice.)

The side effect here is that there will be less divots in the hardened ground which can divert a well played boule, keeping our courts tournament-worthy and in tip-top shape.

In mid-February I was contacted by Whitney Evans of the Sonoma Valley Special Olympics. They are adding Bocce to their program this year and would like our help.

Please don't read this and get hung up on the word "bocce". Whether with a ball the size of an orange or the size of a grapefruit, it's about getting closest to the little one. In fact, it's all about spending time outdoors with other human beings.

The Special Olympics is for special human beings. Whitney has told me that the group is likely to include people of any age with disabilities that usually include some degree of mental retardation. He also told me that people who get involved usually find it to be one of the best things they've ever done.

We'll do it at the club courts on Saturdays from 1pm - 3pm, starting the 21 April until the 30 June. When we've got our group of coaches (I hope about a dozen, so we can cover with four or five each session), Special Olympics will send their bocce coach to teach us how it works. That will happen on April 14. I look forward to getting your call to say that you're in.
