(Apr.22) The cool morning turned into a hot afternoon of pétanque as the Second Annual Mixed Doublette Tournament attracted a healthy number of players of all ages. Representatives from Menlo Park, Sacramento, Willits, Santa Rosa, San Rafael, San Francisco and Lafayette joined a large group of VOMPers for the event. Vice President Dave Ogaz and Secretary Gail StClair put it all together and the participants did the rest with great potluck dishes and good sportsmanship.

The biggest draw of the day came in the final grueling match of the opening rounds. It was a battle royal between Byron Mayo and Holly Sammons and Pascal Gravier and Elizabeth Ogaz. The one hour and forty minute, 13-12 marathon was brought to a dramatic conclusion with a vicious *carreau-sur-place* two inches from the cochonnet by Byron, to the delight of the crowd.

In the Semifinals of the Concours, PJ Mallette and Dolly Ebollito outlasted John Bouldt and Toni Mallette, 13-11. Waiting in the wings were Peter Wellington and Barbara Hall who had dispatched Bart Zachofsky and Teri Sirico with methodical efficiency, 13-7.

In the Final match, youth and experience proved to be the winning formula, as PJ shot à la raffle and Dolly touched the cochonnet for the game's last point, earning a 13-7 triumph. Bart and Teri mopped up for Third Place, finishing off the day with a 13-10 win.

In the Consolante, it was two former VOMPC Presidents on opposing teams. Mike and Susan Norton played valiantly but came up short against Tom Bricca and eleven-year old newcomer Keilyn Rice, 13-8. Dave Ogaz and Gail StClair took Third Place.

(Mar. 24) Forty-eight players showed up for the VOMPC's 4-Ball Singles Tournament. The weather was just T'this side of dry when the games began but cool afternoon showers tested the mettle of playoff participants.

The event staff included Richard Bagel, Gerard Canabou and Frank Pipal, with help from John Krauer and Bart Zachofsky. For the second straight year, "Open" and Women's Divisions were offered. "Bonus" rounds were also put into place, distributing prizes to more players.

In the Open there were a few surprises—from juniors and seniors. PJ Mallette scored a first-round playoff fanny over a well-respected, long-time player who shall remained unnamed. The up and coming Adrian Reyes pulled a "David and Goliath," toppling a VOMPC veteran in the tournament's opening round. Eleven-year-old Patrick Sammons Lheld his own against some of the Bay 'Area's best. Octegenarian and pétanque legend Armand Squitieri pointed his way to the Quarter Final. On the women's side, Karen Semerau earned top honors for the second straight year by defeating Barbara Hall in the final match, again by the score of 13-9. Barbara earned her way there with a marathon 13-12 win over Glory Glover in the Semifinal. New member Judy Olivier took the Consolante crown.

Another Open Division notable was Peter Mathis. Fresh out of winter hibernation, the smiley ex-President took down the formidable Andrew Loi for Third Place. And in the Consolante, it was Mike Norton, Jacques Serafian and Frank Pipal who touched money. Overall, there were eleven prizes distributed in both Divisions. The Umpire's Corner . .

My boule was an inch from the cochonnet, holding the point. My opponent's closest boule was about six inches from the cochonnet.

With his next boule, he tried to shoot my boule out. He missed. But his shooting boule hit the log in back and bounced back into the game, knocking my boule out of position and leaving his first boule closer to the cochonnet.

I said his shooting boule was out of play once it hit the log and that my boule should be put back in place, giving me the point.

He said, "No way, Jose. Unless the position of your boule was marked, you're out of luck."

What's your opinion on this, Ump?

If a boule rebounds back into the playing area after going out of bounds, any boule or cochonnet it hits at that point is put back into place, if the original position was clearly marked.

Literally, your hard-nosed opponent was correct. In a championship match or an FPUSA tournament, that's the way the rules are applied—literally.

However, in a friendly game of petanque on the courts in Sonoma, most players don't take such a rigid stand. (Your opponent already conceded that you were holding the point, when he tried to shoot you out. In the situation you described, I think most players would be willing to replace your boule close to the cochonnet and carry on from there.)

Our courts are a great place to view the fireworks. On July 4th plan to come to the courts for some casual play and potluck treats, starting about 5pm.


New Member/Vet League Ends on High Note

Barbara Hall took the "Stranded Partners" Handicapped Round-Robin and all enjoyed the bounty of a lovely potluck feast.






Spiffed-up Courts Take on a New Look

And you may notice the "amendments" to some of the court surfaces, the coarse gravel making them extrachallenging.

On the North Courts two shade trees have been planted, complete with irrigation lines. Some of the older boundary boards have been replaced in the central median. The barbeque has received its long-awaited adjustable coal rack. The inside of the shed has been shelved, racked and organized. Trees have been pruned and the flowers are pushing up nicely. 
