


Boulliabaise, Paella and Pétanque!

Day Grand Concours de Pétanque!



(May 6) Twelve hearty boulists, including two women doublettes, journeyed to **Ebollito** the annual Memorial Tournament in Menlo Park for a funfilled day of pétanque, hosted by Rene and Nicole DiMase, Rafael and Christiane Meucci, all of Marseille, France and Dolly Ebollito of La Boule Joyeuse Pétanque Club. The final match of the Open was swift and merciful as homeboy John Henry Bouldt and Louis Toulon delivered a 13-2 shellacking to Christian Triay and Tom Nguyen, the Los Angeles team who won the coveted Wine Country Classic in Sonoma last July. The Umpire's Corner . .



In a tournament match, my testy opponent tosses the cochonnet. It looks short. He walks it off and claims that it's good. Then he asks me if I think it's good. I tell him, "I don't know." He asks me if I want to walk it off. I tell him, "No."

He tosses his first boule. It ends up about two inches from the cochonnet. Then, I pull out my tape and measure the distance. And it's definitely short. So I tell him to toss the cochonnet once again.

He refuses. He says the round began when he played his first boule. "No turning back," he says.

What do you say, arbitre?

You have the right to contest the distance until you have either accepted the location of the cochonnet or played your own boule.

In the situation you cite, the fact that you did not want to walk off the distance prior to your opponent's toss of his boule did not constitute an acceptance of the distance.

You had every right to measure the distance after he tossed his first boule. Then, when a confirmed tape measurement proved the toss was short, he should have brought his cochonnet back and tossed it out again.

(When he refused to do this, of course, you should have immediately called over the tournament arbitre.)
