Giant paella pans will be filled with the myriad ingredients and cooked over wood fires for all to enjoy. It's as fun to watch the cooks as it is to eat.



Erin and Shannon played well but fell to their friends, 6-13.


In the final match, facing the wonderful and vivacious Dolores Bush (many times a National Champion) and newcomer Sylvie Rothenberg from Los Angeles, our gals prevailed 13-11 in a pointing clinic that left many a male pointer shaking in his sabots.

Although Dolores took an occasional shot, the rounds invariably finished with a cluster of balls surrounding the cochonnet. The players exchanged turns in the circle, rolling in their boules ever closer to the target. And the crowd loved it, applauding practically ever ball!

At game's end the competitors embraced to the crowd's delight and all were cheered for their good sportsmanship.

The bronze medal was won by Eva Lofaro and Joss Krauer. Earlier in the afternoon, Karen Semerau and Barbara Hall took first place in the consolante.

Twenty-six teams from two coasts, four states and ten clubs were represented in a tough field. Nearly one half finished 2-2 in Sunday's qualification rounds. No team went undefeated as upsets were de rigeur.

After a lackluster performance on Sunday (finishing 2-2), the pair squeaked into the Monday morning pools. There they handed fellow VOMPers PJ Mallette/Peter Mathis and Mal Misuraca/Bart Zachofsky smarting defeats.

It got even easier for them in the afternoon playoff rounds, they gave up a mere five points in three games finishing with the coup de grace—a stunning fifteen minute, 15-0 blowout of John Rolland (Florida) and Pascal Corschia (Los Angeles). WOW!

A dozen or so VOM players competed but, alas, no other pairs made it past the quarterfinals in the highly competitive field.

Michel Saga and Pierre Smets made the consolante final four. Ed Porto and Peter Wellington finished second in that bracket, going down in the final 11-13.

Hail to our sister club La Pétanque Mariniere for a great job hosting the National Doubles Tournaments. Special thanks to Christine Cragg, Jan and Louie Toulon, Eva, Antonio and Sebastian Lofaro, John and Joss Krauer, Bart Zachofsky and all others who helped in many ways.

Their efforts were much appreciated!







(May 25) It was a sunny and warm day in Lafayette, as the Lamorinda Pétanque Club rolled out the red carpet (and a grand buffet!) for twenty mixed doubles teams from around the US. Also in attendance were some well-entertained spectators and a number of FPUSA brass.

As a club, the VOMPC (which sent nine primary members to the field on six separate teams) split all the medals with La Boule New Yorkaise. PJ Mallette and New York's Sylvia Marguez went home to their respective clubs with the gold. The one-day format allowed for few mistakes as the field whittled itself down during the course of the day.

PJ and his trusty partner suffered their lone setback in the morning to eventual bronze medalists Tino Lofaro and Holly Sammons. In the later rounds, PJ and Sylvia tightened up their act, narrowly defeating Peter Mathis and Narin Garrett in a Semifinal, 13-11. When the 2000 Champs Beth Krumholz and Richard Stegman (both of NY) took down Holly and the frustrated Tino, the stage was set for the New Yorkers to settle their differences in the final. And the difference was PI!

As the air temperature dropped before the shivering diehard crowd, Da Weas turned up the heat. After falling behind 8-10, he and Sylvia roared back to close the affair, 13-10, erasing any doubt as to who was the best team on that memorable National Mixed Doubles day.

The Umpire's Corner . . .



I'm the guy who sent in the thorny question you used in the May issue. On a measurement, the arbitre moved the jack. You said, "Once the jack is moved, the arbitre can't measure the point accurately, even with calipers. He must call it as he saw it when he first viewed the situation."

O.K., but what if the arbitre didn't prejudge the situation? What if he walked right up, bent over to measure and slightly moved the jack.

What's the call under those conditions?

In the close and difficult situation you describe, a fair ruling is to have the opponents replay the last two boules. (Most arbitres, however, will carefully make a judgement call before measuring.)

The preparation for the 1988 Second Annual Bastille Day Grand Concours de Pétanque was a grassroots, pioneering effort involving many budding pétanque enthusiasts.

Key planners included our inaugural sponsors, Ravenswood owners John Kemble, Joel Peterson, and Foster Reed. Maryse and Pierre Joske, having been active in La Pétanque Mariniere in San Rafael before moving to Sonoma, were instrumental in establishing ties with other Bay Area pétanque clubs.

The local French liaison was **Annick Bouldt**, via the recently-resurrected French Sisters Cities organization.

Early on in the planning phase, a poll of the known community boulists indicated perhaps twenty people would be able to participate. A good start, but the organizers agreed that attracting the existing Bay Area pétanque clubs was critical to promoting pétanque in the Sonoma Valley.


Thanks to the Joskes, Bay Area boulists responded in good numbers. Ravenswood's John Kemble and staff did an excellent job of preparing an open field along side their original winery site on Broadway for the piste *Triplettes a la mélée* was chosen as the tournament format, in keeping with the spirit of the event.

A large tent was erected and it served everyone well on that 105-degree afternoon. Eighty players and their families were treated to fresh abalone hors d'ouevres, and a delicious luncheon catered by **Joanne** and **Keith Filipello**. Refreshments were donated by our sponsor, Ravenswood Winery.

By day's end, all participants, both locals and visitors, had been treated to a memorable social event, setting the precedence that has become a Sonoma pétanque tradition.
