Revised Bylaws on the Ballot

Five-Month Project Up For Final Vote by VOMPC Membership

VOMPC Articles, Bylaws and Code of Conduct, revised and updated, go on the ballot for membership approval this fall with the Board of Directors' unanimous endorsement.

At the beginning of the year, a blue-ribbon committee appointed by the board, including Chairman Byron Mayo, John Bouldt, Jacques Mathieu, Mal Misuraca and Frank Pipal, took on the job of correcting several errors, eliminating ambiguities, strengthening procedures and reorganizing the club's Articles, Bylaws and Code for greater clarity.

After some five months of effort, the committee presented its work to the Board in June. Minor corrections were made at the request of the Directors. At its July meeting, the Board of Directors approved the final document by a unanimous vote.

It's now up to the general membership. Each member has received a copy of the final document. A proposal to approve the committee's work will be up for a "yes" or "no" vote in the fall election. Results will be made known at the club's annual meeting (see page 7).


Well, it's Oktoberfest, and he'll be at again for the annual Season Finale Picnic and Panaché. A robust menu will accompany the tournament:





On the women's side, drama was in shorter supply as junior player Olivia Sammons and the savvy Shannon Bowman took control of their final match early and never let go. Hard shooting Narin Garrett and the visiting Martha Lewis played well but went down, 13-7.

Barbara Hall and Holly Sammons finished third. Karen Semerau and Elizabeth Lamond won the women's consolante.

PJ Mallette and Alec Stone finished third in the open. In the open consolante, Jean Krauer and Jacques Avedissian of Menlo Park finished with an impressive 13-7 win in trhe final over Michel Saga and Pierre Smets. John Bouldt and Hans Kurz took third place.

The tournament was run without a hitch by Dave Ogaz and Barbara Hall, with Holly Sammons helping with signup. Thank you all!
